It is remembered that on the twenty fifth day of March 1732 William Tidmarsh appeared personally before me one of the Justices of the Peace for the County of Kent and acknowledged himself to be justly indebted unto the Lord property of this province in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling to be levied on his body goods & Chattels Lands & Tenements Conditionally if he shall make his personall appearance before the Justice at June Court next to be held for the County of Kent to answer unto Substitutions as shall be objected against him on his Lordships behalf concerning an assault and Battery by him committed on a certain Daniel Perkins &c in the meantime of the said Justice shall keep the peace & be of good behaviour then the said Recognizance to be void & of no effect

And now here at this Court to wit on the third Tuesday in June being the twenty third day of said Month Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty two came the said William Tidmarsh and in his proper person appeared and prayed to be discharged from the said Recognizance ordered by the Court here that he be discharged as prayed This Court here discharged the same there being no cause shown to the contrary

 Francis Gouk attorney of the right Honourable the Lord property that now is for the County of Kent for the same Lord property in this part prosecute the dole come here into Kent County Court before William Frisby Esq. and his associates his said Justice of the same County to wit at Chester Town in the County of Kent the twenty first day of June Anno Domini Seventeen hundred thirty and two and for the same Lord property doth give the Court here to understand and be informed that William Tidmarsh late of St. Pauls parish in the County of Kent Inholder the twenty fifth day of March Anno Domini Seventeen hundred thirty & two at the parish and in the County of Kent within the Jurisdiction of this Court in and upon Daniel Perkins in the peace of God and of the said Lord property then and there being with force and arms an assault did make and the said Daniel then and there did beat wound & evilly treat so that of his life it was much disparaged and other harms to him then and there did to the great Damage of the said Daniel and against the peace of the said Lord property his good rule and government wherefore the said Attorney prayeth the advice of the Court here in the premises for the said Lord property and due process of Law against the said William in this part to come to answer to the said Lord property of and upon the premises &c

and
