Therefore it is considered by the Justice here to wit at a Court hold for the County of Chester in the Town of Chester in said County on the thirduuesday in June being the twentieth day of said Month Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and thirty two That the said William Tidmarsh pay the sum of one hundred pounds of Tobacco to his Ships Husband property as a fine for committing the assault and also it is considered that the said William Tidmarsh pay the sum of two hundred and eighteen pounds of Tobacco costs accruing on the process aforesaid

His Ship's Memorandum. May 12. 1732 Mary MaCarthy known lodged her self disabled into the R. Hon. the Lord property of Maryland his heirs and Successors in the sum of Ten pounds Sterling to be levied on her Body goods & Chattels Land & Tenements Conditionally if she the said Mary doth not make her personall appearance at our next Court of the said County to be held at Chester Town to answer unto such Matters as shall be then & there objected against her by Ellen Mainamara concerning an assault & Battery made this day on the said Ellen by the said Mary & concerning some other Misdemeanors tending to a breach of the peace and that if she do not depart without leave of the Court and till then be of good Behaviour then this Prodigiance to be void otherwise to be & remain in full force & virtue in Law Taken before us two of the Lord's Justices for the County of Chester
