

not gainsay the Indulment as to as against him brought nor can he say but that he is
 guilty of the adultery as by the said Indulment is alleged and thereupon submits to
 the Court Therefore it is considered by the Justices here to wit the same
 day and year last mentioned that the said James Bayer pay the sum of three pounds
 current money as a fine for committing the offence in form of Coufart and also
 it is considered that the said James Bayer pay the sum of five hundred &
 forty eight pounds of Tobacco costs accruing on the premises as to the officers
 of this Court

This Court orders that John Grosham Gent Sheriff of said County keep the
 said James Bayer in Custody until he shall satisfy the fees in bills Indulment
 to the officers of this Court

John Brown Junior an Evidence against James comes into Court and being
 sworn saith that he attended the same cause three days ordered by this Court that

the said James Bayer pay the sum of ninety pounds of Tobacco for his attend:

as aforesaid to the said John Brown

Rachel Bostick an Evidence against James comes into Court and being sworn
 saith that she attended the same cause three days ordered by this Court that the
 said James Bayer pay to the same Rachel Bostick the sum of ninety pounds
 of Tobacco for her attendance as aforesaid

Hent County in Maryland Be it Remembred that on the tenth of this
 Instant October 1732 Robert Mear and Charles Smith did acknowledge them:
 selves Justly Indebted unto the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietary of the
 Province of aforesaid in the sum of Twenty pounds Sterling money each to be
 Levied on their Bodies goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally
 that if a certain James Bayer of the aforesaid County do not make his personal
 appearance before the Justices of Hent County Court on the third Tuesday of Novem:
 ber next then and there to answer unto all such matter and things as

shall be objected against him concerning his begetting a bastard Child on the
 Body of a certain Rachel Bostick of the aforesaid County and do not depart
 without leave of the Court then the said Acknowledgments taken before me to be
 void otherwise to stand and remain in full force

And now here at this Court to wit on the third Tuesday in November being
 the twenty first day of said Month Anno Domini 1732 Robert Mear and
 Charles Smith came the said James Bayer and in his proper person
 appeared and prayed his Security, recognizance taken as aforesaid for
 his appearance might be discharged ordered by the Court here
 that the said Acknowledgments as aforesaid be discharged as prayed Robert
 Mear and Charles Smiths Acknowledgments as aforesaid are by this Court here
 Discharged there being no cause shown to the contrary
