Under this Condition to wit that if the above bound Solomon Cary shall personally appear before the Justices of the said County at a Court to be held for said County on the third day of this Instant November at the Court House in the Town of West in said County to answer unto all such matters as shall be then and there objected against him on behalf of the Same Lord Proprietor and if he do not depart the same Court without leave and if in the mean time he shall be of good behaviour then the above Recognizance to be void else to stand in full force and virtue.
