writ came John Gresham Gentleman of said County and made a return to the
Court there thereof endorsed as follows Viz. John Gresham Sheriff.

The Jurors for the right honourable the Lord Proprietaries that
now is for the body of Kent County and upon their oath do present that Stephen Glanville
of St. Pauls parish in the County of Planter and Joseph Nicholson of the same
parish in the County of Gentleman the tenth day of October anno Domini one thousand
seven hundred thirty and two at the parish and in the County and within the Jurisdiction of
this Court in and upon Oliver Shaw in the peace of God and of the said Lord Proprietaries
then and there going with force and arms an assault did make and then the
said Oliver then and there did beat wound and cruelly beat so that of his life
it was much despaired and other harms to him then and there did to the great
Damage of the said Oliver and against the peace of the said Lord Proprietaries
in god rule and dignity of

on the same was endorsed as follows Viz. Simon Welton foreman
and the said Stephen Glanville and Joseph Nicholson in their proper
persons comes and say that they cannot gainsay the Indulment of Peace
and against them brought Nor can they say but that they are guilty
of the premises above upon them imposed as by the said Indulments
it is alleged and thereupon submit to the Court. Therefore it is
considered by the Justices here to wit at Kent County at the Court House in
the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in June being the
