At the third Tuesday in June being the nineteenth day of said Month Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty three the said George Moore appeared and the same was continued until the third Tuesday in August next.

At which said third Tuesday in August being the twenty first day of said Month Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and thirty three came the said George Moore and in his proper person appeared and prayed the recognizance as aforesaid taken might be defiled. Ordered by this Court here that the recognizance taken as aforesaid be defiled.
