The said Judgment was endorsed by a true bill of Simon Wilmer foreman
 and the said Henry Barber came and in his proper person saith that he
 cannot gainsay the Judgment and so as aforesaid against him brought was
 he say but that he is guilty of the assault and as by the said Judgment it
 is alleged and thereupon submit to the Court. Therefore it is
 ORDERED by the Justices here to wit at their County Court House in
 the Town of Hatteras in said County on the third Tuesday in August being
 the twenty first day of said Month Anno Domini one thousand seven
 hundred thirty three that the said Henry Barber pay the sum of one
 thousand pounds of Tobacco to the use of his Lordship as a fine for committing
 the assault & in fine and comfort and also pay the sum of two
 hundred eighty three pounds of Tobacco costs accruing on the premises
 to the officers of this Court

Ordered by this Court that Henry Barber of the said County Labourer
 later into recognizance with Security for his appearance to next Court
 thereupon the said Henry Barber of the said County Labourer in his
 proper person present in Court came and acknowledged himself bound
 to the Right Honourable the Lord Proprietor in the sum of ten
 pounds Sterling to be made and levied on his body goods and Chattels
 Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors
 conditionally that if he shall not make his appearance at next Court
 to be held for said County on the third Tuesday in Nov. next and in the
 mean time he is to be of good behav^r. wherewith he acknowledges
 himself to be content

Like wise James Abraham Ambrose of the said County planter and
 Nehemiah Powell of the said County Subodor and in the proper person
 in Court came and acknowledged themselves bound to the right
 Honourable the Lord Proprietor in the sum of five pounds Sterling
 each to be made and levied on their bodies goods and Chattels
 Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his heirs
 and Successors conditionally that if the said Henry Barber shall
 not appear at the next Court to be held for said County on the third
 Tuesday in November next and in the mean time he is to be of good behav^r.
