To the use of the said Lord Ship his heirs and Successors Conditionally that if the said Nathaniel Hyson shall not make his appearance at the next Court to be held for said County at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in Nov^r next ensuing to answer unto an Judgment found against him for assaulting John English and that in the mean time he is to be of good behav^r. where with the same John Gresham and James Smith did know ledge themselves therewith to be content

Sheriff did know ledge himself indebted unto the Right Hon^{ble} the Lord prop^{ty} of Maryland his heirs and Successors ten pounds Sterling to be levied on his body goods & Chattels Lands and Tenements Conditionally if the said Samuel Glen doth not make his personall appearance before the Justice of the said Lordships Court to be held at Chester Town in the said County the third Tuesday of August next then and there to be answer to such matters and things as shall be objected against him by John English of said County concerning him the said Samuel's Error Whipping the said John d^r. and in the mean time that to the said Samuel be of the good behav^r and do not depart the Court without Licence these his Recognizance to be void otherwise to remain in force and Virtue Taken and Acknowledged before me one of the said Lord prop^{ty} Justices for said County Geo^r Shipwell

at which said third Tuesday in August being the twenty first day of said Month Anno Domini thousand Seven hundred and thirty Three Came the said Samuel Glen and appeared and prayed he might be discharged from the said recognizance ordered by this Court here that the said recognizance be discharged as prayed Samuel Glen and his recognizance taken on oath in the sum of ten pounds Sterling for his appearance as aforesaid and to answer as above is by this Court here done there being no cause shown to the contrary

the Jurors for the Right Hon^{ble} the Lord prop^{ty} for the said County and upon their oath do present that Samuel Glen of St. Pauls parish within the County of Kent the tenth day of July Anno Domini thousand Seven hundred thirty and three at the parish aforesaid within the Jurisdiction of this Court in and upon John English in the peace of God and the said Lord prop^{ty} then and there being with force and arms an assault did make and him the said John then and there did beat wound and cruelly treat so that of his life it was much impaired and other harms to him then and there did to the
