 Tenements Separately to be made and Levied for the use of his
 said Lordship his heirs and Successors if Default be made in the
 Condition hereunder written. The Condition of this Recognizance
 is such that if the above bounden Laughlin O Bryan do and appear
 personally appear before his L^{ords} Justices at Chester Town in
 Kent County at the next County Court there to be hold the third
 Tuesday of this Instant August to answer unto such matters and
 things as shall be then & there objected against him by Lydia
 Bratton concerning an assault and battery lately made upon the
 said Lydia by the ~~said~~ above bounden Laughlin O Bryan and in
 the mean time that he be of the good behaviour and do not
 depart the Court without Licence then this Recognizance to be
 void otherwise to remain in force and virtue taken and
