 Lord Proprietary that now is in the Sum of ten pounds Sterling to be made and levied
 on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his
 heirs and Successors conditionally that if the said John English doth not make
 his personall appearance at the next Court to be held for said County on the third
 Tuesday in August next ensuing and then and there to answer unto what shall
 be objected against him on his said Lordships behalf for his committing a breach
 of his said Lordships peace and an assault on Thomas Prior of the said County
 and in the mean time he is to be of good behav^r. and not to Depart the said
 County Court without leave where with he acknowledges himself thereof

 objected against him on his said Lordships behalf for committing a breach of
 his said Lordships peace and an assault on Thomas Prior of the said County
 and in the mean time to be of good behaviour and not to Depart the Court wth out
 leave where with the said James Ruggold acknowledges himself content
