Memorandum that James Francis Gould attorney of the right
 Honourable the Lord Proprietor that now is for the County and City of the same Lord
 Proprietor in this part professeth doth come here into that County Court before William
 Friday Esq. and his associates his doct shop Justices of the same County to wit at
 Chester Town in the said County the Twelfth day of August Anno Domini 1733
 Seven hundred thirty & three and for the said Lord Proprietor doth give the Court
 here to understand and be informed that James Robas late of S. Pauls par.
 ish in the County of York the tenth day of January Anno Domini 1733
 Seven hundred thirty and two at the parish and in the County and within the Jurisdiction
 of this Court falsly fraudulently deceitfully and unjustly to James Stuart
 of the same County Mariner did affirm and aver that he the said James
 Robas then and there was called and known by the name of Richard Mason
 and that the said James Robas by and in the name of the said Richard
 Mason then and there falsly fraudulently deceitfully and unjustly drew
 goods wares and Merchandizes of the goods wares and Merchandizes of the
 goods and Chattels of George Strange Jun. of the value of two hundred
 pounds of Tobacco for Tobacco to be paid thereafter did buy and purchase
 and that the said James Robas falsly fraudulently deceitfully and
 unjustly then and there in and by the name of the said Richard Mason to the
 said James Stuart did promise that he the said James Robas by
 the name of Richard Mason and Tobacco for the said goods wares and
 Merchandizes unto John Harvey on behalf of and to the use and behoof of the
 said George Strange Junior when thereto afterwards he should be requir-
 ed well and faithfully would pay and content whereas in truth and in fact
 the said James Robas never was called known or reputed by the name of
 Richard Mason to the great Damage and deceit of the said George
 Strange to the evil example of all others and against the peace of the said
