 in October 1733 — Susannah Macey of the afo County did
 acknowledge herself fully indebted unto the Right Honourable

 and Chattels Lands and Tenements — Conditionally that if
 she doth not make her personal appearance before the Justice of this
 Shire Court to be hold for Kent County on the third Tuesday of November
 next then and then to give such Evidence as she knows against a certain
 Mary Broods of the afo County concerning her feloniously Stealing a
 Logg of the good and Chattels of a certain James Maunomb of the afo
 County and do not depart without leave of Court that then this Recognizance
 to be void otherwise to stand and remain in full force

James Maunomb Aguis Boyer and Rosmond Clayton as Evidence on
 this Lord Shire behalf against the afo Mary Broods are Sworn and
