the use of his said Lordship his Heirs and Successors Considerationally That if  
a certain Lawrence Neale shall not make his personally appearance at this  
Court house in March then next ensuing at the Court House in the Town of  
the Court House held for the said County to answer unto what shall be objected  
against him on his said recognisance behalf on acc<sup>t</sup> of Committing fornication with  
a certain Jane Flanagan &c. and in the mean time he is to be of good behav<sup>r</sup>  
wherewithall heacknowlegges them selves to be lawfull subjects under your  
hundre<sup>d</sup> Kent County aforesaid Wednesday and year aforesaid

All now here at this Court house at Kent County at the Court House in the Town of  
Chester in said County on the third wednesday in March being the nineteenth day of said  
Month anno Domini One Thousand Seven hundred and thirty three Com<sup>r</sup> the aforesaid  
Lawrence Neale and in his proper person appeared and prayed that his said  
Recognisance as aforesaid might be discharged Ordered by this Court here that  
the aforesaid recognisances taken as aforesaid for the appearance of the said Lawrence

the sum of Two pounds Sterling each are by this Court hereby charged therin  
being no cause shown to the contrary

the body of Kent County aforesaid upon their Oath do present that Lawrence Neal late of  
Shrewsbury parish in the County aforesaid Labourer the tenth day of April in the year of  
our Lord God Seventeen hundred and thirty three at the parish aforesaid in the County aforesaid  
within the Jurisdiction of this Court did Commit fornication with a certain Jane  
Flanagan and of her body then and there had carnal knowledge and a bastard child  
on the body of her the same Jane then and there did bring to the High displeasure  
of Almighty God to the evil example of all others in such case offending Contrary  
to the peace of the said Lord Prop<sup>r</sup> that now is his good rule and Government and  
against the form of the Act of Assembly in such case lately made and passed  
by the said Jane Flanagan
