 County on the third Tuesday in March being the nineteenth day of said Month Anno Domini one
 Thousand Seven Hundred and thirty three & being the day of return of said writ come John
 Gresham Gentleman Sheriff of said County and made return to the Court here thereof endorsed as follows

 Proprietor that now is his good Rule and Government and against the form of the Act of

 and now here at this Court to wit at Kent County at the Court House in the Town of Chesham
