

and upon their oath do present that Mary Graves late of St. Pauls parish in the County of  
 Squinter though there a free Mollatto and the Servant of Arthur Miller of the same parish and  
 County's Court being the tenth day of May Anno Domini Seventeen Hundred thirty three at  
 the parish of in the County of within the Jurisdiction of this Court did Commit Fornication with  
 a person to the Jurors and unknown and did permit the same unknown person then and there  
 to have carnal knowledge of her body and to beget then and there a bastard child on the body  
 of her the same Mary about same bastard child the said Mary afterward to wit the tenth  
 day of February Anno Domini Seventeen Hundred thirty three at the parish of in the County  
 and Jurisdiction of did bear contrary to the peace of the said Lord precept his good rule and  
 Government and against the form of the Act of Assembly in such case lately made & provided  
 To wit Arthur Miller & Deborah his wife

On the same Indictment was endorsed as follows True bill by the Grand Jury. Forasmuch  
 as now here at this Court to wit at the Court House in the Town of New  
 in said County on the third Wednesday in March being the nineteenth day of said Month Anno  
 Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred and thirty three sent the Lord precept by Justice  
 Francis his atty and the same attorney prayed that the said Mary Graves might to the  
 Indictment and answer so as against her brought

and the said Mary Graves came and in her proper person appeared and said that  
 she cannot gainsay the Indictment and so as against her brought nor but that she is  
 guilty of the premises above upon her imposed as by the said Indictment it is alleged  
 and thereupon submits to the Court. Therefore it is considered by the Justices  
 here to wit the same day and year last mentioned that the said Mary Graves at the  
 Expiration of her Service she is to be employed as also for the time in the Indictment  
 in the other Indictment) her Service seven years to the use of the said County for her committing  
 the offence and in form of the Act of Assembly in such case lately made  
 and provided and also pay the sum of Two hundred twenty and nine pounds of the  
 fees accruing to the officers of this Court on the premises

Ordered by this Court that the said Mary Graves for the last time in bearing the  
 this disgrace of her Master's House Charge in bringing to bed she serve at the Expiration  
 of her time of Service on whole Year to the same Arthur Miller his heirs or assigns

This Court orders that a Note be set up at the Court House Door that there is to  
 be disposed of two Mollatto Children one two year old the other six weeks  
 Copy of which order was accordingly done

Ordered by this Court that Mr. Arthur Miller have allowance of one thousand pounds of  
 Tobacco for keeping the said two Mollatto Children to this Court at the Laying the body  
 at next November

Mr. Arthur Miller comes into Court and desires the said Mollatto woman for the  
 two seven years and also the said Mollatto Children to which the Court agrees  
 to be paying Two hundred pounds of the fees of the Sheriff of the County for the use of  
 the same County and acquitting the one thousand pounds of Tobacco to be allowed  
 him the next Levy for the man to name of the said Children to which the same
