

Arthur Miller agrees and promises to pay the sum of two hundred pounds of Tobacco as aforesaid and thereupon the Court orders that the said Mary Graces serve the two years as aforesaid to the same Arthur Miller his heirs and assigns

and also that the said two Mullahto Indians serve till they arrive each at the age thirty one years to the same Arthur Miller his heirs and assigns

His Lordship Commanded was given on the nineteenth day of March in the Twenty<sup>th</sup> year of his Lordships Dominion W. Anno Domini one Thousand Seven hundred and thirty three To the Sheriff of Kent John Hall County that he should take John Hall late of Morgans Crook Hundred in Shrosvury Parish in the County of Kent if he shall be found in his bailiwick and him safe keep so that he have his body before the Justice of our County Court hold for said County at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County immediately to answer unto a certain Information for concealing a fugable to wit John Smith and that the same Sheriff have at the same Court the said word &c

And now here afterwards at the said Court Court to wit at Kent County at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in March being the nineteenth day of said Month Anno Domini one Thousand Seven hundred and thirty three came John Gresham Gent. Sheriff of said County and made return to the Court there thereof as follows by Levi Corpus J. J. Gresham Sheriff of Kent County. Be it Remembered that Jacob Francis Gent. Attorney of the right Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is who for the same Lord Prop. in this part prosecuted doth come here into the County Court of the same Lord Prop. of Kent County aforesaid to wit at Chester Town in the County aforesaid the nineteenth day of March Anno Domini Seventeen hundred thirty and three before James Harris Esq. and his associates the said Lord Prop. his Justice of Kent County Court aforesaid and for the same Lord Prop. doth give the same Justice here to understand and be informed that John Hall late of Morgans Crook Hundred in Shrosvury Parish in the County aforesaid the nineteenth day of June Anno Domini Seventeen hundred thirty and three was possessed of a house in the same Hundred and County and within the Jurisdiction of this Court being and then and there was the chief person and Master of the Family in the same House then residing and that Thomas Morrell Constable of the same Hundred duly authorized and qualified the same nineteenth day of June in the year aforesaid repaired in person to the same House and did then and there require of the said John Hall a true List from under his hand distinctly naming all the taxable persons which he then had within his said Family and also to the same John Hall then and there did give unto the same Thomas Morrell a list and amount of sundry taxable persons in the said Family then residing yet he the same John Hall the Laws of this Province
