Arthur Miller Esqrs and friends to pay the sum of Two hundred pounds of Dollars and
 and Thereupon the Court Orders that the aforesaid Mary Goods be paid the two former
 years aforesaid to the same Arthur Miller his heirs and assigns
 And also that the aforesaid two Millatta Caledon Goods left they arrived each
 the age Thirty one years to the same Arthur Miller his heirs and assigns

If His Lordship commanded was given on the nineteenth day of March in the
 Twenty ^{eth} year of his Lordships Dominion Anno Domini One
 Thousand Seven Hundred and thirty three To the Sheriff of Kent
John Hall County that he should take John Hall late of Morgans Creek
 Hundred in Shrewsbury Parish in the County aforesaid and shall be found in
 his body with and him safe keep so that he leave his body before the Justice of
 our County Court held for said County at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said
 County immediately to appear unto a certain Information for committing a vagabond
 to wit John Smith and that the same Sheriff have at the same Court the said
 and so —

And now here afterwards at the said Court came to witness Kent County at the
 Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in March being
 the nineteenth day of said Month Anno Domini One Thousand Seven Hundred and
 thirty three by John Gresham Esq; Sheriff of said County and made return to the
 Court House thereto advised as follows by his Corpus Jn Gresham Sheriff —
 Kent County Sir Be it remembred that Francis Gent attorney of the right
 Honourable the Lord Proprietary that now is and for the same Lord Proprietary in this part
 presented doth come here into the County Court of the same Lord Proprietary of Kent County
 aforesaid to wit at Chester Town in the County aforesaid the nineteenth day of March Anno Domini
 Seventeen hundred thirty and three before James Harris Esq; and his associates the
 said Lord Proprietary his Justices of Kent County aforesaid and for the same Lord Proprietary doth
 give the same Justices here to understand and be informed that John Hall late of
 Morgans Creek Hundred in Shrewsbury Parish in the County aforesaid on the nineteenth
 day of June Anno Domini Seventeen hundred thirty and three was possessed of a house
 in that same Hundred and County and within the Jurisdiction of this Court being and there
 and there was the chief person and Master of the family in the same House then
 residing and that Thomas Moseley Constable of the same Hundred duly authorized
 and qualified the same nineteenth day of June in this year aforesaid did repair in person
 to the same house and did then and there require of the said John Hall a declaration
 from under his hand distinctly naming all the vagabond persons which he then had
 within his said family and also the same John Hall then and there did give unto
 the same Thomas Moseley a list and account of sundry vagabond persons in his said
 family then residing yet he the same John Hall the laws of this Province
