Thereupon afterwards came the said William Collins and acknowledged himself indebted to the Right Hon. the Lord Prop. in the Sum of Twenty pounds to be made and Charged on his body goods and Chattles Lands and Tenements to the use of his Lordship his heirs and Successors Conditionally that if he do not make his personal appearance at the Court any time during the Court sitting to answer unto what shall be objected against him on his Lordships behalf for assaulting the said Theophilus Randall and in the mean time to be of good behaviour where with he acknowledges himself content.

also at the same Court came James Hare of Kent County planter and present in Court in his proper person and acknowledged himself indebted to the Right Hon. the Lord Prop. in the Sum of Twenty pounds to be made and Charged on his body Goods and Chattles Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors and Conditionally that if the said William Collins shall not anytime during this Court sitting answer unto what shall be objected against him on his Lordships behalf on account of assaulting the said Theophilus Randall where with the said James Hare acknowledges himself to be content.

The Court orders that Theophilus Randall enter into Prosequer for his app. any time during this Court sitting to prosecute the said W. Collins for assaulting him as a Post Office
