Richard Davis aforesaid his recognizance taken as aforesaid in the sum of Twenty pounds Sterling for the appearance of the said Mary Spearman to appear and answer in aforesaid and to be of good behavior. The same recognizance is by this Court here defied there being no cause shown to the contrary &c.

And now at the same time aforesaid came John Wright jun. and in his proper person appeared and prayed his recognizance might be defied. ordered by this Court here that the same recognizance be defied John Wright jun. his recognizance aforesaid being taken in the sum of five pounds Sterling for his appearance as an evidence at this Court against the said Mary Spearman. The same recognizance is by this Court here defied &c.

And now also at the same time aforesaid came Mrs Margaret Shippey and appeared and prayed Mr Charles Hynson recognizance for her appearance as aforesaid might be defied. ordered by this Court here that the same recognizance be defied as prayed Mr Charles Hynson aforesaid having entered into recognizance in the sum of five pounds Sterling for the appearance of the said Margaret Shippey at this Court to prosecute on his Lordships behalf against the said Mary Spearman. The same recognizance is by this Court here defied there being no cause shown to the contrary.

to keep the peace. appeared John Claver of Kent County planter and acknowledged himself indebted to the right Hon^{ble} the Lord Proprietor in the sum of Twenty pounds Sterling money of Great Brittain to be made and payed on his body Goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors Conditionally that if a certain Benjamin Claver shall not make his personall appearance at the next Court to be hold for the said Kent County on the third Tuesday in March then next ensuing to answer unto what shall be objected against him on his said Lordships behalf on account of his committing fornication with a certain Elizabeth Evans. and that in the mean time he is to be of good behaviour In Testimony whereof I have set my hand this day and year aforesaid.
