his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of his Said Lord Ship his heirs
and Successors conditionally that if he shall not make his personall appearance
at the next Court to be held for Kent County at the Court House in the Town of Chester
in Said County on the third Tuesday in June then next ensuing to answer unto what
shall be objected against ^{him} on his said Ship's behalf on account of his assaulting
William Graves aforesaid and in the mean time he is to be of good behaviour wherewith he
acknowledges himself to be contented

Also at the Same Court came Morgan Hurst of Kent County Planter in his proper person
and present in Court cometh and acknowledges himself indebted to the Right Hon. the
Lord Proprietor in the Sum of Ten pounds Sterling money of Great Brittain to be made
levied on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of his Said
Lord Ship his heirs and Successors conditionally that if the aforesaid Patrick Clarke
shall not appear at the next Court to be held for Kent County at the Court House
in the Town of Chester in Said County on the third Tuesday in June then next to
answer unto what shall be objected against him on his said Lord Ship's
behalf against assaulting William Graves and in the mean time the Same
Patrick Clarke is to be of good behaviour wherewith the Same Morgan Hurst
acknowledges himself to be contented
