Daniel may be made to answer unto the same Lord Proprietary of and upon  
the premises &c. — Francis —

and the said Daniel came and in his proper person saith that he  
cannot gainsay the Information aforesaid against him brought  
nor can he say but that he is guilty of the promises above upon him  
imposed as by the said Information it is alleged and thereupon submits  
to the Court Therefore it is considered by the Justices here to wit  
that the Court at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County  
on the third Tuesday in June being the eighteenth day of said Month  
anno domini 1734 Thousand Seven hundred and thirty four that the said  
Daniel shall be fined the sum of two hundred pounds of Tobacco  
to the use of his Lordship his heirs & Successors as a fine for committing  
the assault aforesaid in form aforesaid and also pay the sum of four  
hundred and eight L pounds of Tobacco fees accruing on the  
premises aforesaid to the officers of this Court

Ordered by this Court that Sincerely be given for the fine aforesaid  
Thereupon George Garnett of Kent County Shoemaker personally came  
and in Court acknowledged himself indebted to the Right Hon. the  
Lord Proprietary in the sum of four hundred pounds of Tobacco to be  
made and levied on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements  
to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors conditionally  
that if he do not pay the sum of two hundred pounds of Tobacco by  
the tenth day of November next to any person that shall require the  
same for his said Lordship wherewith the same George Garnett  
acknowledges himself content

Ordered by the Court here that Sincerely be given for the fees aforesaid  
Thereupon George Garnett of Kent County Shoemaker personally  
came into Court and acknowledged himself indebted unto the  
Right Hon. the Lord Proprietary in the sum of six hundred pounds of  
Tobacco to be made and levied on his body goods and Chattels Lands  
and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship his heirs and Successors  
conditionally that if he do not pay the officers fees aforesaid amounting  
to the sum of four hundred and eight  
pounds of Tobacco as aforesaid wherewith the same George Garnett  
acknowledges himself content
