His Lordship I Be it Remembered that on the tenth day of June Anno Domini
 one Thousand Seven hundred and thirty four Personally came
William Salisbury before me one of his Lordship's Justices of the peace for Kent
 County in the Province of Maryland Daniel Perkins of Kent
 County Milright and acknowledged himself indebted to the Right Hon. the Lord
 Proprietary in the sum of twenty pounds Sterling to be made and levied on
 his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of his said Lordship
 his heirs and Successors conditionally that if a servant of his named William
 Salisbury shall not make his personal appearance at the next Court to be held
 for Kent County at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the
 third Tuesday in June then next ensuing to answer unto what shall be objected ag-
 gainst him on his Lordship's behalf and in the mean time to keep the peace and to do
 good behaviour wherewith the same Daniel Perkins acknowledges himself to be
 content. In Testimony whereof I have set my hand the day and year aforesaid

and now here at the Court holden at Kent County at the Court House in the Town of Chester in
 said County on the third Tuesday in June being the eighteenth day of said Month Anno
 Domini one Thousand Seven hundred and thirty four came the aforesaid William Sal-
 isbury and in his proper person appeared and prayed his Master Daniel Perkins's
 Recognizance might be discharged as above taken for his appearance this
 Court Order that the same Recognizance be discharged as prayed
 Daniel Perkins his Recognizance taken as aforesaid is by this Court here discharg'd
 there being no cause shown to the contrary

and the same tenth day of June Anno Domini one Thousand Seven hundred
 and thirty four came John Nevill of Queen Anne County Planter before me
 one of his Lordship's Justices for Kent County and acknowledged himself indebted
 to the Right Hon. the Lord Prop. in the sum of five pounds Sterling to be
 made and levied on his body goods and Chattels Lands and Tenements to the use of
 his said Lordship his heirs and Successors conditionally that if he shall not app-
 ear at Kent County Court on the third Tuesday in June next to give his obedience on his
 Lordship's behalf against the aforesaid William Salisbury. wherewith the
 same John Nevill acknowledges himself to be content

In Testimony whereof I have set my hand the day and year aforesaid
 and now here at the said Court holden at Kent County at the Court House in the
 Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in June being the eight-
 teenth day of said Month Anno Domini one Thousand Seven hundred and
 thirty four came the aforesaid John Nevill and appeared and prayed his Recogni-
 zance taken as aforesaid might be discharged ordered by this Court that the same
 Recognizance taken as aforesaid be discharged
