 red and Sixty — pounds of Tobacco to be awarded on the
 premises afo to the officers of this Court

Ordered by this Court that the fine afo be delivered the Sheriff of
 Kent County, and John Fresham Gent Sheriff of the said County
 acknowledge the receipt thereof —

 came his said Lordship by his atty afo and the said Patrick in
 his proper person and defends the force and injury afo
 and saith that he is in no sort guilty of the premises above upon
 him imposed as by the afo Indulment it is alleged and of this he puts
