 unto the assault and the same is by this Court here discharged there
 being no cause shown to the contrary

Elizabeth Dunningham at the same time and gave surety as an oath
 against the said Jane Green for her appearance to this Court the same
 Elizabeth at this Court appears and prays that her surety's Recognizance
 for her appearance be discharged ordered by this Court here that
 the said Recognizance be discharged as prayed — Benjamin
 Griffith of Henr County ordered into recogniz^{ce} in the sum of five
 pounds for the app^r of the said Elizabeth as an oath against the
 said Jane Green. The same Recognizance is by this Court here
 discharged there being no cause shown to the contrary

 him then and there did to the great Damage of the said Elizabeth
 and against the peace of the said Lord Proprietary his good rule
 and Government &c. Wherefore the said attorney of the said Lord
 Proprietary for the same Lord Proprietary prays to the advice
 of the Court here in the premises and that due process of Law in
 this part against the said Jane may be made to answer unto the
 same Lord Proprietary of and upon the premises &c. Harris
