

Tuesday in August being the twentieth day of said month came down I do remember hundred
 and thirty four came in his said Lordship by his atty and the same William
 Grand in his proper person and defends the force and injury whom he said
 saith that he cannot gain say the Information etc so as att against
 him brought nor can he say but that he is guilty of the assault
 etc in the Information etc by the same is alleged and there
 upon submits to the Court Therefore it is considered by the
 Justices here to wit at the said Court as aforesaid that
 that the att William Grand do find the sum of five Shillings
 to the use of his Lordship his heirs and assigns as a fine for
 committing the assault etc in form of aforesaid and also the sum
 of three hundred and forty pounds of Tobacco cost
 arising on the premises etc to the officers of this Court
 ordered by this Court that the same fine be delivered the Sheriff
 of Kent County Thereupon the said Sheriff of Kent County
 came into Court and acknowledged the receipt of the same fine
 ordered by this Court to be that surely he gave for fees etc
 thereupon Henry Culley of Kent County who is present in Court in
 his proper person and acknowledged himself indebted to the Right
 Honourable the Lord Proprietor in the sum of six hundred pounds of
 Tobacco to be made and conveyed on his body goods and Chattels
 Cunds and Towns to the use of his said Lordship his heirs
 and assigns conditionally that if the said William Grand
 shall not pay the said fine then then to the said Henry
 will do it for him who oweth the same Henry acknowledged
 himself to be bound on

The att William Grand at last Court entered into recognizance
 for his appearance at this Court to answer the assault etc
 and of good behav^r and the said William at this Court
 app^r and prays that the same recognizance may be taken
 as also his sureties for his appearance ordered by this
 Court here that the same recognizance be such as prayed
 William Grand his recognizance as aforesaid in the sum of
 ten pounds and be such there being no cause shown to the contrary
 Henry Culley surety at last Court for the att William Grand in the sum of
 ten pounds The same recognizance is by this Court here
 discharged there being no cause shown to the contrary
