 then & thore being found thon & thore feloniously did Steal & bear away
 contrary to the peace of the R^e Lord Proprietarie that now is his Goodwill
 and Government & against the form of the act of Assembly in such
 case lately made and provided.

The Verdict of the Jury was given to the Sheriff of Kent County that he
 immediately cause to come here to sue^d him. By whom &c. who imph^ded.

 to wit John Griffran Gent now here at this day to wit the eighth day of March
 A^r 1728 anno Dom^r One Thousand seven hundred and twenty eight
 makes return that he hath here ready to sue^d him as by his process
 he was commanded and now here afterwards to wit the day and year last
 mentioned came againe the aforesd William Boonis in his proper person and
 the aforesd Propriet^r by his attorney aforesd and the Juries of that Jury
 being Impowered and called likewise came to wit James Moore W^m

 County on the third Tuesday in March being the eighth day of
 said Month anno Dom^r One thousand seven hundred and twenty eight
