

That the said William Boon's stands in the pillory half an hour and that afterwards he receive at the public whipping post twenty one lashes well laid on his bare back till the blood appears as a punishment for his said Crime of Committing the Felony and according to the force form and effect of the writ and also it is considered that the said William Boon's pay the Sum of four hundred and eighty pounds of Tobacco the Value of the four fold of the goods safe they being valued at one hundred and twenty pounds of Tobacco and also the Sum of Nine hundred Sixty Nine pounds of Tobacco Costs accruing on the premises and to the Officers of this Court

It is also considered by the Court here at this day to wit the day of your last mentioned that the Sheriff of Row County take the said William Boon's into his custody and execute the punishment in the Judgment and specified & afterwards to bring him into Court again of which precept the said Sheriff to wit John Gresham Gent Sheriff of Row County makes return on the day and year last said that he hath executed the said Judgment and also hath here ready the said William Boon's before the Court

ordered by the Court here that Surety for the four fold and fees be given On which came into Court a certain William Elms of said County Planter and Gentle that he will pay the four fold and amounting to the Sum of four hundred and eighty pounds of Tobacco and also the said Sum of Nine hundred Sixty Nine pounds of Tobacco the Costs and

The said William Boon's the second day of February Anno Domini 1728 before M<sup>r</sup> William Frisby one of the Justices of this Court Entered into Progn in the Sum of forty pounds Sterling money for his Appearance at this Court to answer unto what should be objected against him & on and of Stealing a Sack and bundle of a certain W<sup>m</sup> Carman &c. The said William in his proper person appeared and prayed his Progn might be discharged as also his Surety. For his Appearance It is ordered by the Court here that the said W<sup>m</sup> Boon's Progn as aforesaid be discharged The same is by this Court here discharged

also William Elms of said County Entered into Progn for the Appearance of the said William Boon's In the Sum of twenty pounds Sterd which is by this Court here discharged

also at the same time the said W<sup>m</sup> Carman in the Sum of twenty pounds Sterd as aforesaid before the same Justice. against the said W<sup>m</sup> Boon's The said W<sup>m</sup> Carman in his proper person appeared and prayed his Progn might be discharged It is ordered by the Court here the same be discharged The said Progn is discharged

also at the same time the said John Wilson in the Sum of ten pounds Sterd as aforesaid against the said W<sup>m</sup> Boon's The said John in his proper person appeared and prayed his Progn be discharged The same is by this Court here discharged
