Sent now here at this day to wit the eighteenth day of November Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and twenty Nine make return that he hath here ready twelve shillings as by his precept it was commanded And now here afterwards to wit the day and year last mentioned came again the said Lord Proprietarie by his attorney and the said Andrew in his proper person and the Jurors of that Jury being impanelled like wise came to wit William Woodland Charles Smith Thomas Borley David Rogers Junr. Morgan Hunt William Deane Sam. Goding John Mearns John Clayton Joseph Hull John Browning & Dan Bryan who being duly called tryed and sworn to say the truth in the premises upon their Oath do say that the said Andrew Norwill is guilty as he stands indicted and by William Woodland there foreman all to say Therefore it is considered by the Justice here at the Court House in the Town of Chester in said County on the third Tuesday in November being the eighteenth day of said Month Anno Domini Seventeen hundred twenty and Nine that the said Andrew Norwill for his offence according to the verdict of the Jurors stand in the pillory one quarter of an hour and then receive on his bare back two lashes to the blood appear as a punishment for his crime and felony according to the form force and effect of the verdict of the Jurors and also it is considered that the said Andrew Norwill pay the sum of Eight hundred and twenty eight pounds of Tobacco Cost accruing on the premises and to the officers of this Court

It is also considered by the Court here at this day to wit the day and year last mentioned that the Sheriff of Kent County take the said Andrew Norwill into his custody and receive the sum of in the Judgment and I ordered and afterwards to bring him into Court againe Off which precept the said Sheriff to wit Joseph Young sent high Sheriff of Kent County make return on the day of year last said that he hath executed the said Judgment and also hath here the said Andrew Norwill before the Court

And thereupon the Court committs him the said Andrew Norwill into the custody of Joseph Young Sheriff of said County until the four shillings amounting to two shillings current money and the fees on the premises be paid

A certain Dan Greenwood before M. Philip Howard Junr. one of the Justices of this Court on the twenty second day of Octob. Anno Domini Seventeen hundred and twenty Nine came into Recognizance in the sum of twenty pounds
