

of the General Assembly of Maryland, codified as Section 233 in Duckett and Clagett's Code for Prince George's County, be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Section 233. All tax sales of real estate shall be advertised for four consecutive issues, any other provisions in any of the local laws relating to tax sales in Prince George's County to the contrary notwithstanding, in three newspapers published in Prince George's County, to be selected by the Treasurer; provided that the newspapers so selected shall have been established in their respective towns at least two years preceding the date of the first publication of said advertisement; and the cost of such advertisement in and for each newspaper shall not exceed the sum of seventy cents for a tax sale, which sum of money shall be charged against the property offered for sale as items of cost. A tax sale shall consist of all the real estate in any election district of the county advertised for sale and belonging to the same person. In the matter of the sale of personal property for taxes, the Treasurer shall be allowed costs similar to those allowed by law in the cases of seizure and sale of personal property by distraint, except he shall receive no fee or commission therein.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect on the first day of June next.

#### CHAPTER 523.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 28 of Chapter 14 of the Acts of 1904, relating to the collection of taxes in Wicomico County and the election of a Treasurer, as said section was amended by Chapter 494 of the Acts of 1920 increasing the compensation of the Deputy Treasurer of Wicomico County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 28 of Chapter 14 of the Acts of 1904 relating to the collection of taxes in Wicomico County and the election of a Treasurer, as said section was amended by Chapter 494 of the Acts of 1920, be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments to read as follows:

28. The Treasurer shall appoint a deputy, who shall perform such duties as said Treasurer shall require and for whose
