(60) To the grant, sale, deed and conveyance of two lots executed by Randall White to the Fulton Baptist Church, a body corporate, said deed being dated October 8th, 1909, and recorded among the Land Records of Baltimore City, in Liber S. No. 2595, folio 134, etc., conveying two lots of ground situate on the northeast side of Division Street one hundred and fifty feet southeast of Baker Street and fronting thence on Division Street fifty feet, with a depth northeastwardly of about seventy-five feet.
