the direction of Lieut. Col. W. C. Langfitt" and approved in March, 1912, by W. C. Langfitt, Lieut. Col., Corps of Engineers, United States Army, and filed in the office of the Superintendent of Lighthouses of the Fifth Lighthouse District, in Baltimore, Maryland,—the said point (A) being at the intersection of the former mean low-water line as delineated on said plat and the boundary line between Prince George's County, Maryland, and the District of Columbia) and running thence along the said mean low-water line to point (B) (which point B is at the intersection of the said mean low-water line and a retaining wall there situated), and running thence along said retaining wall N 84° 33′ 57" E, twenty-two feet, more or less, to a point (C), (the southeast corner of the retaining wall of the Battery Cove reclaimed area), thence N 1° 22' W, two hundred and eighty-five feet, more or less, to the point (D) (the intersection of the retaining wall with the boundary line between Prince George's County, Maryland, and the District of Columbia), thence S. 45°W, three hundred and thirty feet, more or less, along the said boundary line between Prince George's County, Maryland, and the District of Columbia, to the place of beginning; the whole comprising .927 acre, more or less, being a portion of the same tract of land which was conveyed by Charles I to Lord Baltimore by the Charter of June 20, 1632; the said maintenance or construction of the Lighthouse or other aids to navigation in the said Battery Cove area to constitute the consideration for the conveyance to the said United States of America.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That exclusive jurisdiction in and over the said land so deeded to the United States shall be and the same is hereby ceded to the United States for all purposes except the service upon such property of civil and criminal process of Courts of this State, but the jurisdiction so ceded shall continue no longer than the said United States shall own such land.

SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1924.

## CHAPTER 122.

AN ACT to authorize and direct the County Commissioners for Montgomery County to issue bonds in an amount not to exceed twenty-seven thousand five hundred dollars and to levy and collect taxes on the assessable property of Mont-
