"Health and Sanitation", so as to provide that no sewerage system shall be established by the County under the provisions of the Act of 1912, Chapter 157, unless it be located beyond the limits of the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County, and also providing that the construction of any such system shall be under the supervision of the Chief Sanitary Engineer of the Metropolitan District.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 279 of Offutt's Code of Public Local Laws of Baltimore County of the Edition of 1916, title "Baltimore County", sub-title "Health and Sanitation" be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

SEC. 279. No sewerage system shall be established by the county under the provisions of the Act of 1912, Chapter 157, unless it be located beyond the limits of the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County. Such system, if established, shall be in accordance with plans approved by the State Board of Health or some properly qualified representative designated by it. The work required in the construction of all such systems shall be let by contract to the lowest responsible bidder after proposals duly advertised, and such work shall be done under the supervision and subject to the approval of the Chief Sanitary Engineer of the Metropolitan District of Baltimore County. No payment on account of such work shall be made without the approval of said Engineer.
