imprisonment for not more than one year, or both in the discretion of the Court.

Any such incorrect, false or untrue statement shall be prima facie evidence that said statement was knowingly and wilfully made.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1927.

CHAPTER 535.

AN ACT to repeal Sections 314 and 326 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Public General Laws of Maryland (Bagby's Edition, 1924), title "Health," sub-title "Optometry," and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to add a new section to said Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Health," sub-title "Optometry," said section to be known as Section 328 and to immediately follow Section 327 in said Article.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sections 314 and 326 of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Public General Laws of Maryland (Bagby's Edition, 1924), title "Health," sub-title "Optometry," be and the same are hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments so as to read as follows:

314. Out of the funds coming into the possession of said Board, each member thereof attending the meetings for examination and registration may receive as compensation the sum of three dollars for each applicant that may be examined; and, further, each member may receive as compensation a sum to be determined by said Board which shall not exceed ten dollars for each day actually engaged in necessary duties of his office and the actual amount of travelling expenses of such member incident to attending said meetings of the Board. In addition to any amounts which may be allowed by way of per diem and travelling expenses, as above provided, all hotel and inci-
