

days before the end of the fiscal year for which such appropriation is made, whether and to what extent the unexpended balance of such appropriation, if any there will be at the end of said fiscal year, is needed to meet obligations incurred during that year and which will be unpaid at the end thereof. Any unexpended balance of such appropriation, against which there will be no such outstanding obligations at the end of the fiscal year, shall revert to the Treasury of the State at the end of the fiscal year; provided, however, that appropriations for the acquisition of land, buildings, equipment and new construction shall be available for such purposes subsequent to the fiscal year for which the same are made, if approval of the Governor is obtained before the end of such fiscal year; otherwise such appropriation which may be unexpended or unappropriated as above set out shall revert in the same manner and to the same extent as other appropriations.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted,* That if any additional funds from any source whatever in excess of the appropriations herein made shall come into the hands of any department, board, commission, officer, or institution of the State, the same may be expended by such department, board, commission, officer or institution, with the approval of the Governor; any such excess not so expended shall revert to the Treasury of the State at the end of the fiscal year in which the same is received by such department, board, commission, officer or institution, unless there shall be an outstanding obligation against the same incurred with the approval of the Governor.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted,* That all funds in the State Treasury at the end of each fiscal year, which are not directly obligated by some specific appropriation herein or hereinbefore made, shall, at the end of each fiscal year, revert to the general Treasury of the State, whether the same be now carried as special funds or general funds; provided, however, that this section shall not apply to the State Accident Fund, nor to the State Game Protection Fund, nor to the receipts from the Public School Tax which may be in the Treasury prior to the beginning of the fiscal year in which they are appropriated.

SEC. 5. *And be it further enacted,* That where any increase is made herein in any salaries fixed by any Act of the General Assembly heretofore enacted, the passage of this Act shall
