F. B. No. 13, folio &c.

(f) To the bequest of two-fifteenths of the residue of her estate to the Trustees for The Cassell Home for the Aged to be used for its corporate purposes as set forth in the Second Codicil of the said last will and testament of said Lydia Cassell, deceased, duly admitted to probate and of record as aforesaid.

(g) To the bequest of one-fifteenth of the residue of her estate to the Trustees for The Cassell Home for the Aged as set forth in the third codicil of the last will and testament of said Lydia Cassell, deceased, duly admitted to probate and recorded as aforesaid.
