

restrictions. In case the determination of the Board of Education of Prince George's County not to use the funds provided for the purposes specifically mentioned in Section 2, or any of them, shall be made after the bonds have been sold, then and in that event, they may by resolution request the County Commissioners to substitute for the specific purposes for which the said bonds were sold, or any of them, the construction of such new schools, or of such additions to schools or the purchase of such sites as said Board of Education may consider advisable and if the County Commissioners of Prince George's County concur in such changes, or any of them, they shall by a resolution approve the same, and thereupon such new items shall be substituted for the items in Section 2 of this Act, which the said Boards desire to abandon, and the Board of Education shall proceed with these new items in the same manner and with the same powers and restrictions as if the same had been originally mentioned in Section 2 of this Act.

SEC. 7. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and being passed upon a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 172.

AN ACT to extend the limits of the Mayor and Common Council of Hyattsville, a municipal corporation, by including therein a part of Prince George's County contiguous thereto.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That there is hereby annexed to the territory of the Mayor and Common Council of Hyattsville, hereinafter called the town of Hyattsville, all the adjacent and contiguous territory in Prince George's County described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the easterly line of the property of the Missionary Sisters, Servants of the Holy Ghost,
