out a certificate of authority granted by the Commission. If the certificate of authority is refused, no further proceedings shall be taken before the Commission, but a new application may be made therefor after six months from the date of refusal.

CHAPTER 339.

AN ACT to exempt agricultural or horticultural or live stock fairs and exhibits in Wicomico County, Maryland, from county and municipal taxation for fifteen years.

(Vetoed.)

CHAPTER 340.

AN ACT to add nine new sections to Article 99 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, title "Wild Fowl—Birds and Game," sub-title "Water Fowl," to follow Section 37 of said Article as designated in Senate Bill No. 105 of the Session of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1927. Said new sections designating the boundaries of the area at the Head of the Chesapeake Bay to be known as the "Susquehanna Flats," prescribing rules and regulations for the hunting of water fowl within said area and providing for the policing and prescribing penalties for the violations of the provisions thereof.

SECTION 1. For the purposes of this Act, all that part of the Chesapeake Bay and its waters lying within the following lines shall be known as the "Susquehanna Flats," more briefly referred to herein as the Flats.

All that portion of the Chesapeake Bay and tributaries lying south of a line drawn east from Concord Lighthouse, in Harford County, to Carpenters Point, on the western shore of Cecil County, and north of a line beginning at the lighthouse on Turkey Point, in Cecil County, and drawn westerly to a point half a mile north of the northerly part of Spesutia Island; thence continuing said line still westward; but at no time ap-
