SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, That the Governor, Comptroller of the Treasury, and Treasurer, constituting the Board of Public Works, or a majority of them, are hereby authorized and directed to have prepared proper certificates of indebtedness of the State in good and sufficient form to aggregate the amount of two million, one hundred and twenty-five thousand dollars (\$2,125,000) as evidence of such loan; such certificate of indebtedness shall bear date as of the time of their issue, as provided in Section 1 of this Act, and shall not be issued in less sums than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), but may be issued in sums of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or any multiple thereof.
