

provided by the Commissioners of Oxford at said election there shall be printed the words, "For Water Supply Loan," and "Against Water Supply Loan," with a square after said words, in each case, for the (x) mark of the voter, and the voter may vote thereon by an (x) mark after his choice, and if there be a majority of votes cast in favor of said loan, then this Act and the provisions thereof shall go into effect immediately; and if there be a majority of votes cast against said loan, then this Act shall be null and void, except as hereinafter provided.

In the event that a majority of votes cast at the special election as provided for in this Act shall be against said loan, then the Commissioners of Oxford shall submit the water supply loan herein proposed in the same manner and under the authority of this Act at the regular municipal election held in said town in 1928, in the same manner and method as hereinbefore provided.

SEC. 11. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and having been passed upon a yea and nay vote, supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 465.

AN ACT to provide additional compensation for the judges of the Orphans' Court for Talbot County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Judges of the Orphans' Court for Talbot County shall each receive, in addition to the compensation now received, the sum of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2.50) per day for every day's attendance upon the session of said Court.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect January 1, 1929.
