To the following bequests to Trinity Reformed Church at Manchester, Carroll County, Maryland, a religious corporation, contained in the last will and testament of George L. Warner, late of Carroll County, deceased, duly admitted to probate and of record in the Orphans' Court of Carroll County, Maryland, viz:

(a) To the bequest of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars to said Trinity Reformed Church, of Manchester, Carroll County, Maryland, the income to be used perpetually for the upkeep of his cemetery lot, and lots of his father and mother and other relatives.
