provisions of this Act, are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1st, 1929.

CHAPTER 558.

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 17 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (Edition 1924), title "Clerks of Courts," sub-title "Clerks of Circuit Courts," said new section to be known and designated as Section 59A, and providing that printed forms of conditional sales contracts offered for recordation shall be printed in certain type.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That one new section be and the same is hereby added to Article 17 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (Edition 1924), title "Clerks of Courts," sub-title "Clerks of Circuit Courts," same to be known as Section 59A and to follow immediately after Section 59 of said Article and to read as follows:

Section 59A. Any person, firm or corporation offering for recordation in the clerk's office any conditional sales contract upon a printed form shall cause said forms to be printed in good, clear, readable, of not less than eight-point type. The recording charges for any such instrument not conforming to the requirements of this section but offered for recordation may be three times the charge now allowed by law for the recording of the same.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1929.

CHAPTER 559.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 37 of Article 16 of Bagby's Annotated Code of Maryland (1924 Edition), title "Chancery," sub-title "Divorce."
