by the Acts of 1924, Chapter 12, be, and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

216S. The Attorney for the County Commissioners shall be the attorney of the Road Directors at a salary of four hundred (\$400.00) dollars per year in full of all compensation for all services rendered, and the County Commissioners shall provide said directors a room in the Court House, and the Clerk of the Commissioners shall also act as Clerk of the Road Directors, at a salary of four hundred (\$400.00) dollars per year in full for all services rendered. The Clerk of the Road Directors shall attend all of the meetings, keep the minutes thereof, be the custodian of the corporate seal of the Road Directors, and affix the same to all papers and instruments requiring such seal, and perform such other services as from time to time may be required of him by said Road Directors. The Road Directors are also authorized to employ such other clerical assistance as may be deemed necessary, at a salary or cost not to exceed \$1,000.00 per year, to be paid out of the funds of the Road Directors for Allegany County.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect from the first day of June, 1929.

CHAPTER 82.

AN ACT to repeal Sub-section 13 of Section 1 of Chapter 96 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1922, relating to the salary of the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Cumberland, and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to provide for a referendum by the voters of the City of Cumberland upon the provisions of this bill.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sub-Section 13 of Section 1 of Chapter 96 of the Acts of 1922, pertaining to the salary of the Mayor and Councilmen of the City of Cumberland be and the same is hereby repealed, and re-enacted so as to read as follows, to wit:

13. The Mayor shall be President of the City Council. The said Mayor and Councilmen shall take an oath before the
