Senate Bill No. 5—By Senator Hoff:

A Bill entitled "An Act to add a new section to Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition and 1947 Supplement), title 'Crimes and Punishments', sub-title 'Gaming', said new section to be known as Section 302³/₄, and to follow immediately after Section 302¹/₂ of said Article, as said section was enacted by Chapter 708 of the Acts of 1949, making it lawful to hold or conduct carnivals, bazaars, bingo games or raffles by certain organizations or corporations in Carroll County."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judicial Proceedings.

Senate Bill No. 6—By Senator Goldstein:

A Bill entitled "An Act to authorize and empower the County Commissioners of Calvert County to borrow upon the faith and credit of said County the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.) at a rate of interest not to exceed three per cent. (3%) per annum, and to issue notes and/or bonds therefor, for the purpose of erecting a new consolidated elementary school for the North Beach-Chesapeake Beach-Randall Cliff area in the Third Election District of Calvert County, altering and remodeling the Fairview Consolidated Elementary School in said Election District, and expanding the facilities and buildings at Brooks High School in Prince Frederick."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.

Senate Bill No. 7—By the President:

A Bill entitled "An Act to exempt from all State, County and Municipal taxation the loans and every part thereof, and the interest payable thereon, authorized to be created under Chapter 502 of the Acts of 1949, and Chapter 1 of the Acts of 1949, Extraordinary Session."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance.
