Senate Bill No. 2—By the President:

A Bill entitled "An Act making an emergency appropriation for the payment of expenses of the General Assembly of Maryland for the Extraordinary Session of 1949."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Senate Bill No. 3—By the President:

A Bill entitled "An Act to repeal Sections 306 and 307 of Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title 'Crimes and Punishments', sub-title 'Gaming', and to enact two new sections, in lieu thereof, to stand in the place of said sections so repealed, relating to the issuance of search warrants."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Senate Bill No. 4—By Senator Phoebus:

A Bill entitled "An Act to add a new sub-section to Section 7 of Article 72 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1947 Supplement), title 'Oysters and Clams', said new sub-section to be known as Sub-section (b-1) and to follow immediately after Sub-section (b) of said Section 7, relating to the size of boats used for dredging oysters in Somerset County."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Senate Bill No. 5—By Senator Hoff:

A Bill entitled "An Act to add a new section to Article 27 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition and 1947 Supplement), title 'Crimes and Punishments', sub-title 'Gaming', said new section to be known as Section 302³/₄ and to follow immediately after Section 302¹/₂ of said Article, as said section was enacted by Chapter 708 of the Acts of 1949, making it lawful to hold or conduct carnivals, bazaars, bingo games or raffles by certain organizations or corporations in Carroll County."

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Rules.
