and Taxes of the Maryland National Capital Park and Planning Commission.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect on the first day of June, in the year 1936. Approved April 29, 1936.

CHAPTER 109.

- AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 12 of Article 9 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Charles County," sub-title "Amusement Licenses," relating to the license fees for dance halls and providing for the disposition of the licenses imposed by said section.
- SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 12 of Article 9 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Charles County," sub-title "Amusement Licenses," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:
- Every person, persons or corporation that shall hereafter, hold in Charles County, any dance, picnic or other form of amusement or entertainment for pecuniary profit and gain to the said person, persons or corporation, for which no license is now provided by law, shall, before giving or holding the same, first obtain from the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Charles County, Maryland, a license or permit thereof for which the said clerk shall charge a fee of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each day upon which such entertainment or form of amusement is held, and an annual license fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00) for any person or corporation maintaining and operating a dance hall or other place of amusement, and any person, persons or corporation, who shall be guilty of the violation of the provision hereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and punished by a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and not more than one hundred dollars (\$100), and in default of the payment thereof shall be sentenced to the county jail for a period of not less than sixty (60) days or more than six (6) months; provided, however, that nothing in this Act shall apply to any such entertainment
