condition. The inspector or other duly authorized agent of the Commission when in the performance of their duties and upon presenting proper credentials issued by the Commission, shall have access to private property at all reasonable hours during the week day.

406M. No suit or action in law or in equity shall be be instituted against the said Commission in the performance of its official duties and orders passed by said Commission, which may result in the contamination of wells, the overflowing or faulty operation of cess-pools, or other means of sewage disposal, or plumbing fixtures and appurtenances; or the flooding of cellars by reason of stoppage in sewer lines, high tides or other causes beyond the control of the Commission.

406N. Any person violating the provisions of this subtitle or the rules and regulations made in pursuance thereof, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a penalty of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00 for each and every such violation.

406-O. Nothing in this sub-title shall effect the right, powers and duties of the State Department of Health or the Anne Arundel County Sanitary Commission or Annapolis City or the Annapolis Metropolitan Sewerage Commission.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1st, 1935.

CHAPTER 403.

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments and additions Chapter 425, Section 7C of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland of 1933, codified as Section 7C, following after Section 7 of Article 89B of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland (1924 Edition), entitled "State Roads," relating to construction, reconstruction and maintenance of county roads and municipal streets, and the employment of the personnel theretofore employed.
