

The said Mayor and Commissioners shall define the duties of the Clerk and allow him such compensation for his services as they think proper and all ordinances passed by them shall be entered by the Clerk in a book kept for that purpose and copies of all ordinances passed by said Mayor and Commissioners shall be posted in three (3) public places in said town within thirty days (30) after their passage. The said Mayor and Commissioners shall receive a salary of not exceeding twelve dollars (\$12.00) per year, each.

SEC. 8. *And be it further enacted*, That the said Mayor and Commissioners or a majority of them shall have full power and authority annually at their first meeting on the 4th Monday in September to appoint a treasurer and attorney, bailiff and any other officers that they may deem necessary for the good government of said town and allow them such compensation for their services as they may deem necessary. The said treasurer, in addition to the oath prescribed, shall give bond to the Mayor and Commissioners of Cresaptown in the sum of two thousand (\$2,000) dollars for the faithful performance of his duties. He also must own property of the assessed value of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) within the town limits.

SEC. 9. *And be it further enacted*, That the Mayor and Commissioners of Cresaptown shall have power to pass all ordinances necessary for the good government of said town; to prevent, remove, and abate nuisances or obstructions in or upon the streets, highways, lanes or alleys, drains or water courses, or in or upon any lot or lots adjacent thereto, and to provide for imposing a fine or fines upon any person or persons causing or creating any such nuisance or obstruction; to remove or cause to be removed houses or other structures that may be dangerous to persons passing along or over any of the said highways of the said town; to make reasonable regulations in regard to buildings to be erected in said town and to grant building permits for the same; to open and extend streets, to open alleys, to cause the water courses and drains or sewers of said town to be kept in repair and cleaned; to grant licenses for marketable commodities; to license pool and and billiard parlors, bowling alleys, shooting galleries and to regulate the hours thereof; to regulate and provide for the control of public grounds and the property of the town; to establish and regulate a station house or lockup for the temporary confinement of the violators of the laws and ordinances of the town, to suppress vagrancy and to prohibit the keeping of bawdy houses or houses of ill-fame within the said corporate limits, and to provide for the punishment of all persons who shall knowingly keep or suffer to be kept in their property any such houses; to regulate and provide for the issuing of
