in which the requirements and qualifications for obtaining a certificate of registration are not lower than those specified in this Article. Such practice shall continue only for such time as the Board requires for the consideration of the application for registration; or

- (d) Employees and Subordinates. The work of an employee or a subordinate of a person holding a certificate of registration under this Article, or an employee of a person practicing lawfully under paragraphs (b) or (c) of this Section; provided, such work is done under the direct responsibility and supervision of a person holding a certificate of registration under this Article or a person practicing lawfully under Paragraphs (b) or (c) of this Section; or
- (e) Government Officers and Employees. The practice of officers and employees of the Government of the United States while engaged within this State in the practice of the profession of engineering or land surveying, for said Government.
- or practice of a regular employee of a public utility company, by rendering to such company engineering service in connection with its facilities which are subject to regulation, supervision, and control, in order to safeguard life, health and property by a state or federal regulatory commission having jurisdiction so long as such person is thus actually and exclusively employed and no longer.
- (g) Officers and Employees of Corporations engaged in Interstate Commerce. The work or practice of professional engineering or land surveying, solely as an officer or an employee of a corporation engaged in interstate commerce.
- 22. Invalid Sections. If any section or sections of this Article shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid, this shall not invalidate any other sections of this Article.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That all laws or parts of laws inconsistent with the provisions of this Article shall be and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.
- SEC. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1939.
