by ordinance or resolution direct, and he shall receive for his services such sum per annum, as the commissioners may by ordinance determine.

- 335A. The Town Clerk shall collect all the town taxes hereinafter levied by the commissioners, and all licenses, and receive all fines and other moneys in anywise belonging to the town, and act as treasurer for the town. He shall have full power to enforce the payment of all taxes levied by the commissioners, by suit or by sale or otherwise, as provided by law, and to convey title to any real or personal property sold by him for the non-payment of taxes.
- He shall, before he enters upon the duties of his 335B. office, take before the President of the Commissioners his oath, and also execute a bond to the State of Maryland, in the penalty of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00), for the faithful performance of his duties as town clerk, which bond shall be paid for by the commissioners, and further conditioned that he will well and truly account and be liable for any and all money coming into his possession as town clerk, or for which he shall be secured by a fidelity or surety company qualified to act as security or guarantor under the laws of Maryland; and the same shall be approved by the commissioners, and when signed and approved shall be delivered by them to the Clerk of the Circuit Court for record; and upon his failure to give bond within thirty days after his appointment, the commissioners shall appoint another person to act as town clerk as aforesaid; and in case of vacancy in said office from any cause, the president shall fill the same for the balance of the term; and any person so appointed shall take the oath and give the bond herein required, and perform all the duties of the said office.
- 335C. The town clerk shall keep the assessment books with the names of taxpayers arranged alphabetically, stating the value of each piece of property, real or personal, assessed with sufficient description thereof to identify the same. He shall keep a full and fair cash account showing the sums of money received by him, stating the source from whence the same was received, and showing all the money paid out by him, to whom and for what purpose; and all books, documents and papers pertaining to his office shall be supplied by the commissioners, be the property of the commissioners, and be kept in the office of the commissioners, and be at all times subject to the examination of the commissioners and any taxpayer of said town.
