

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That all Acts and parts of Acts inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistency.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That if any part or provision of this Act shall be held unconstitutional or invalid or unenforceable, the same shall not affect the remaining parts of this Act.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and being passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

## CHAPTER 222.

(House Bill 502)

AN ACT to authorize the Mayor and Council of Crisfield, a municipal corporation, to use the sum of Two Thousand, Seven Hundred Two Dollars and Eighty-seven Cents (\$2,702.87), being the unexpended balance of a bond issue, for current expenses.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That the Mayor and Council of Crisfield, a municipal corporation, be and it is hereby authorized to use the sum of Two Thousand, Seven Hundred Two Dollars and Eighty-seven Cents (\$2,702.87), being the unexpended balance of the bond issue of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00) issued as of October 1, 1938, under authority of Ordinance No. 170, approved June 8, 1938, under authority of Sections 348A-348R, inclusive, of Article 43 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the said sum to be used for current expenses of said town.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and being passed upon a yea and nay vote, supported by three-fifths of all of the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.
